

CLASSIC AND REVIVAL JUBILEE OPEN MEETING 4/5 JUNE 2022 INFORMATION ON CLUB AND LOCAL FACILITIES AT LLANGORSE

1. Arrivals. The Club gate will be unlocked to welcome you from 9.00am on 4 June. Guests who plan to arrive earlier are asked to make arrangements with the organiser, Paul Atwell at drpva18@gmail.com. A family training event is taking place between Monday-Friday the preceding week. Guests are welcome to come to the site and leave boats but are asked not to launch onto the water before the family training has completed.
2. What can you Expect? Llangorse SC is functional and modest, i.e., a 'no frills', low-cost establishment. The Club's facilities are limited, e.g.:
 - No bar facility;
 - Limited catering;
 - No overnight stays on site;
3. What you should Do.
 - Book somewhere to stay.

Llangorse area is popular with tourists and accommodation gets booked up quickly, especially over Bank Holidays. Camping at the 'Clutin Field,' immediate adjacent to the sailing club, has been provisionally 'block booked' by the Club for the weekend of 4/5 June 2022. It has limited facilities, i.e., water and toilets, but is perfectly adequate for a limited stay. It is open for camping, caravans and campervans, and adults should expect to pay £9.50 per night. - For refreshments 'think BYO.'

For those taking part in the open meeting breakfast refreshments on both mornings and a lunch on the Sunday will be provided within the entry fee. It would be useful if competitors registered for the event early, by 23 May 2022, to help with catering numbers.

The Club's galley will be open for hot drinks. However, most bring their own refreshments, a few use the nearby café or bar. These facilities are a couple of hundred metres from the Club off the main thoroughfare through the common, neither accepts bookings and both are busy.

- The Café opens at 9.00am and closes from 4.00pm, serving breakfast in the morning until 11.15am;
- The Lakeside Bar opens at 5.00pm and closes at midnight, serving food up to 8.30pm.

The nearest pub is The Castle Inn which is located about 0.5 miles away in Llangorse village, this can be quite crowded, so the Club often uses the Black Cock Inn that is 1.5 miles away at Llanfihangel Tal-y-llyn, Brecon LD3 7TL.
